

## GENERAL RULES

These rules are intended to define the terms and conditions that apply to all wagers accepted by Dave Edwards Bookmakers Ltd. They cover maximum winnings, our range of bets and betting opportunities. Furthermore, they detail how errors by our staff, or yourself, are dealt with in accepting and settling your wager. It is your responsibility to make yourself aware of these rules and the terms upon which your wagers are accepted. We reserve the right to amend these rules at any time, with any such amendments being displayed on our premises and the onus is on you, the customer, to keep abreast of any such amendments. Please note that any additional information detailed at the top or bottom of events and odds displays, forms part of the betting rules. In the event of any disparity, please note that any such additional information will supercede our betting rules. We consider these rules to be fair and should you require any advice regarding these rules please ask a member of our shop staff. Our staff are there to help you and it is in everybody's interests to ensure that queries and disputes are settled as quickly and amicably as possible. The shop staff will endeavour to provide prompt and considerate attention to errors and disputes but will always have to consult a senior authority before any payment can be authorised. Dave Edwards Bookmakers are registered with the Independent Betting Arbitration Service (I.B.A.S.) who will help to resolve disputes which cannot be resolved satisfactorily between us and customers within a reasonable length of time. Their decision will be binding upon us.

### 1. Acceptance of wagers

- a) Dave Edwards Bookmakers accept bets using the Alphameric slip capture system, when we accept a wager the customer receives a printed receipt bearing a unique bet number and our staff retain the original copy of the wager.
- b) Staff are not allowed to return both copies of a wager to the customer once it has been processed, and if this were to happen the bet would be deemed void, win or lose. (N.B. this does not apply to those customers using mark-sense slips for repeat numbers betting)
- c) It is the responsibility of the customer to ensure the details on the printed receipt are correct before leaving the counter.
- d) The wager will be settled on the instructions as written on the betting slip before acceptance and no verbal instruction given to staff at the time the wager was placed or written instruction added to the printed receipt after it has been processed through the slip capture system will be taken into account for settling purposes.
- e) Wagers are accepted on the condition that they are legible to the manager on duty and their decision shall be final in any dispute arising from ambiguous, illegible or late bets.
- f) Where a wager is deemed to be ambiguous by one of our managers, we reserve the right to split the amount of monies staked between the potential outcomes. Where this is impractical we reserve the right to void the whole of that bet.
- g) The Alphameric slip capture system generates an electronic 'off' signal for all betting opportunities and any wager accepted after this signal has been passed will be deemed void win or lose.
- h) It is your, the customers, responsibility to ensure that there is sufficient time for your bet to be processed before the 'off' signal is generated.
- i) Where a wager has been processed, no amendments can be made unless mutually agreed with our management.
- j) If the customer requires an amendment to the wager at the time the wager is being processed and this amendment leads to the wager being processed after the 'off' signal then that wager or that part of the wager now processed after the 'off' signal will be deemed void, win or lose.
- k) Bets may only be amended or cancelled strictly by mutual consent with our management before the first selection has run or the first event has taken place, once a bet has started it cannot be amended in any way.
- l) On occasions authority may be required from our management before a wager can be processed (especially with large stakes) and it is the customer's responsibility to ensure the wager is placed in time for such authority to be obtained before the race/event is 'off'.
- m) Errors or omissions in the spelling of a named selection will not render a wager void as long as we are happy with the customer's intentions.
- n) No wager will be processed by our staff until they are confident that the customer has sufficient funds to cover the wager.
- o) Any customer who deliberately delays payment or attempts to distract members of staff during the acceptance of a wager will take responsibility for any such wager being void as a

result of their behaviour.

- p) We do not accept wagers written in pencil and customers will be requested to re-write any such bets, and we accept no responsibility for any late selections resulting from the re-writing of bets. (i.e. bets placed close to the 'off' for the first selection which have to be re-written may result in the first selection being placed after the 'off' and therefore that selection deemed void).
- q) Where a price is requested on any selection, the price given will be the price available at the time the wager is processed by the slip capture system.
- r) Once a race has been deemed to have 'weighed in' that result will stand and any subsequent voiding or amendment of a result by Judges, Stewards, Jockey Club Officials or any other governing body will not alter the result that we will pay out on.
- s) Any bet taken in error for an event which has already taken place or where betting has been suspended (other than 'in-running' betting) will be deemed void. For an event such as a football match where a wager has been accepted up to 5 minutes after the advertised kick-off time bets will stand providing the final outcome is not known, and that no participant/team has gained any material advantage (i.e. a score, sending off etc...) at the time the wager was processed.
- t) We reserve the right to refuse the whole or part of any wager.
- u) The law states that no person under the age of 18 years old can be admitted to any of our licensed premises.
- v) Any person causing a disturbance of an offensive nature or is guilty of intimidating other customers or members of our staff will be required to leave the premises immediately and if refusing to do so the police will be called.
- w) We reserve the right to refuse admission to any person to any of our licensed premises at any time.
- x) The consumption of alcohol on our licensed premises is not permitted by law and any one guilty of consuming alcohol at any time on our premises will be required to leave and if refusing to do so the police will be called.
- y) The above rules apply to all bet types. Where necessary we have produced detailed rules relating to specific betting opportunities.
- z) Dave Edwards Bookmakers shall accept no liability for any damages or losses which are deemed or alleged to have arisen from delays or interruptions in operation or transmission, communication or lines failure, any person's misuse of our equipment or any errors or omissions in content.

## 2. Maximum Payouts

- a) All limits are inclusive of any of Dave Edwards Bookmakers special bonus payments and apply to any one person or syndicate in any one day and will take into account duplicated bets. It is important to bear the following amounts in mind as we cannot be responsible for bringing them to your attention at the time the wager is placed.
- b) HORSES: £50,000 where all selections are for horse racing in the U.K. or Ireland, and covered by a full service (betting shows, offs, and results broadcast by S.I.S. and displayed in our shops)
- c) HORSES: £10,000 for all overseas horse racing, or where any of the selections are not covered by a full service ( as detailed above )
- d) HORSES (ANTE-POST): £10,000 ( this limit will apply to a group of customers selecting the same combinations) who we believe to be acting in a consortium )
- e) HORSE & GREYHOUND FORECAST DOUBLES: £10,000 ( N.B. forecast trebles and upwards are not accepted.)
- f) VIRTUAL HORSES & GREYHOUNDS: £10,000
- h) TOTE DIRECT: No limit to any Tote bet which is processed via a Tote Direct Terminal (Subject to Tote Direct rules)
- i) TOTE BETS: (INCLUDING BETS STRUCK AT FOREIGN TOTE RETURNS) When we are unable to process Tote bets through our Tote Direct Terminals our limit is £10,000 to any one person or syndicate in any one day. It should be noted that we are unable to process 'Scoop 6' & Place Only betting without the use of a Tote Direct Terminal.
- j) GREYHOUNDS: Limits apply depending on which tracks are involved.  
 GROUP A: £10,000 to any B.A.G.S meeting covered in full (betting shows, offs and results broadcast by S.I.S. and displayed in our shops) or by Sky sports  
 GROUP B: £5,000 to any open race where the full card appears in the Racing Post  
 GROUP C: £5,000 to the following tracks; Belle Vue, Brough Park, Catford, Crayford, Hall Green, Hove, Monmore, Nottingham, Oxford, Perry Barr, Romford, Sheffield, Swindon, Walthamstow, Wimbledon  
 GROUP D: £1,000 to the following tracks; Harlow, Henlow, Kinsley, Mildenhall, Milton Keynes, Peterborough, Poole, Portsmouth, Reading, Rye House, Shawfield, Sittingbourne, Stainforth, Sunderland, Swaffham, Yarmouth  
 GROUP E: £1,000 applies to any other track not listed where we advertise prices or where we

make it clear we are prepared to accept wagers.

(N.B. in multiple bets with mixed tracks, the lower group limit will apply if more than one group is involved, any bet accepted in error and not covered in any of the above will be deemed void, win or lose)

k) FOOTBALL: £10,000 for all main European leagues (Premiership, Nationwide divisions 1, 2, 3, Scottish Premier league, Champions League, UEFA cup, La Liga Primera, Serie A, Bundesliga and Le Championnat Premiere) & International matches. £5,000 for all other leagues apart from Australian soccer. £10,000 for all Australian soccer

l) GOLF BETTING: £10,000

m) SPORTS BETTING: (NOT COVERED BY THE ABOVE): £10,000

n) IRISH LOTTO: £10,000

o) 49's BETS: £10,000

p) FIXED ODDS TERMINALS: £50,000

q) OTHER NUMBERS BETTING: £10,000

r) GLOBAL GREYHOUNDS: £10,000 to any one customer or group/syndicate of customers including bets from the same source on any one Global Greyhound event.

s) NOVELTY BETS: £10,000 (Snow at Christmas, Christmas No.1, next manager of a team, Big Brother winner etc.):

PLEASE NOTE: The maximum payout to any one customer in any one day is determined by the day on which the final race/event is resolved, rather than the day each individual wager is placed.

### **3. Double Result Betting**

Dave Edwards Bookmakers pay out on both the original and the amended result on all win and each-way singles on horse racing up to a limit of £200 win or £100 each-way stakes with the following exceptions;

- a) Any horse that takes the wrong course.
- b) Disqualification by the Clerk of the Scales.
- c) Any English or foreign Tote bets.
- d) Any racing from outside the U.K. & Ireland

### **4. Distance Betting**

Dave Edwards Bookmakers regularly offer customers the chance to bet on the distance that a horse nominated by us may win by, these speciality wagers are governed by the following rules;

- a) If the nominated selection does not win all wagers are losers.
- b) Prices may vary on the chosen distance as betting on the nominated selection changes.
- c) Should the nominated selection be withdrawn not under orders then all wagers will be void.
- d) Once the nominated selection has come under orders all wagers will stand.
- e) If runners other than the nominated selection be withdrawn not under orders wagers will stand but may be subject to a rule 4 deduction.
- f) In the event of a nominated selection being involved in a dead heat then the selection is deemed to be the winner and distance result 'under' for settling purposes.
- g) For this speciality bet the result we pay out on is 'First Past the Post' only.

### **5. Jockey's Mounts**

a) We accept win and each way wagers on jockey's mounts. b) Wagers for doubles and upwards will apply to all mounts ridden by the stated jockey at the first meeting of the day at which the stated jockey rides after your wager has been processed unless specific races are indicated on your betting slip.

c) When a jockey is riding at both an afternoon and evening meeting and you wish your wager to stand at just one or both meetings) it is your responsibility to ensure your wager is marked correctly.

d) If a jockey has no mount in a race specified on your betting slip then that selection will be treated as a non runner for settling purposes.

e) Should a jockey change (for whatever reason) take place then wagers will be settled on the mount actually ridden, regardless of the runners and riders as advertised in any race card or newspaper or any other source.

f) We accept no responsibility for incorrect information regarding jockey arrangements advertised in the press or any other source.

g) We do not accept wagers on trainer's selections.

h) We do not accept wagers on owner's selections.

## 6. Related Contingencies

We do not accept multiple wagers where the respective outcomes are related, related meaning that should one event happen the outcome of another event in the wager becomes more likely to happen (i.e. Generous to win the Derby, Generous to win the Irish Derby and Generous to win the Prix De L'Arc de Triomphe). Should a related wager be accepted in error then the whole stake will be equally divided as singles on selections as written with the price given for the first race/event to take place being accepted and subsequent selections being settled at prices available immediately after the previous race/event has been completed. Should no price be available for subsequent races/events then that part of the wager will be deemed to be void. (N.B. This rule does not apply to 'scorecast' wagers or where the related contingency is governed by a single price on a specific betting opportunity offered by our race room).

## RULES REGARDING HORSE AND GREYHOUND RACING

### 7. Each-Way Betting

Place terms: -

Bets are settled to win unless 'Each-Way' is clearly requested on the betting slip. An each-way bet is a bet of twice the selected unit stake. It contains one bet of unit stake on the selection to 'win' and one bet of unit stake on the selection to 'place' according to the place terms advertised for the event. In general, for U.K. horse and greyhound racing only, the 'place' part of each-way bets will be settled as per the following 'place' terms.

- a) Handicaps of 16 or more runners  $\frac{1}{4}$  odds 1,2,3,4.
- b) Handicaps 12 to 15 runners  $\frac{1}{4}$  odds 1, 2, 3.
- c) All other races of 8 or more runners  $\frac{1}{5}$  odds 1, 2, 3.
- d) 5, 6 and 7 runners  $\frac{1}{4}$  odds 1, 2.
- e) Less than 5 runners, place money is invested to win.

In all races the number of runners shall be the number of runners coming under starters Orders. Each-Way doubles, trebles & accumulators etc... will be settled 'win to win' & 'place to place' unless clearly requested otherwise. If equally divided settlement is required it must be clearly requested on the betting slip and will apply to all bets on that slip. Place only bets are not accepted (with the exception of certain speciality bets advertised on our screen system) and if a place only bet is taken in error the whole stake will be invested equally between win and place. Where a place investment is in excess of the amount invested to win, the total stake will be invested equally between win and place.

### 8. Favourites

Disputes frequently arise from customers mis-timing (or neglecting to time) wagers where favourites or other unnamed selections (or numbers) are selected. To avoid any disappointment we strongly recommend great care be taken in the placing of such wagers.

- a) We accept win only wagers on unnamed first and second favourites and should an each-way bet be accepted in error the 'place' part of any wager will be invested to win.
- b) In the event of two selections starting joint favourites they will be deemed as joint first & second favourites and stake monies will be divided equally. Where three or more selections start co-favourites stake monies will be divided proportionately.
- c) Unnamed favourites and second favourites where no time or meeting is stated will stand on the next race to take place subject to our 'off' signal procedure.
- d) Unnamed favourites and second favourites where a meeting but no time is stated will stand on the next race to take place at that meeting subject to our 'off' signal procedure.
- e) Unnamed favourites and second favourites where a time but no meeting is stated and the time stated could refer to two or more different meetings covered on the main service provided by S.I.S. then the total stake money will be divided equally between both/all such events.
- f) Unnamed favourites and second favourites where a time stated does not coincide with the meeting stated shall stand on the race as timed with the meeting stated being discounted.
- g) We do not accept unnamed second favourites on greyhounds.
- h) Where a favourite is withdrawn without coming under orders and no new market is formed then for settling purposes the selection will be deemed a non runner. Unnamed favourite/second favourite wagers are not accepted at English or foreign Tote prices and if accepted in error will be deemed void win or lose.
- i) Unnamed favourite/second favourite wagers on races where no Starting price is returned will be deemed void Win or lose.

### **9. Dead heats Short heads**

a) Where two runners dead-heat half the stake money is lost and the full odds paid on the other half of the stake money. If more than two runners dead heat the stake is proportioned accordingly. If two runner's dead heat for second (or third) place then those runners are deemed to have finished joint second and third (or joint third and fourth) etc..., with place bets being settled accordingly.

b) Dave Edwards Bookmakers will refund your win single bet if your horse finishes second beaten a shorthead. This offer applies to UK horseracing only and on Win singles up to a maximum stake of £200 from any one person or syndicate or combination of slips from one source.

### **10. Under/Over-Staked Wagers**

It is the customer's responsibility to correctly stake all wagers as per instructions for the wager as written. If you are unsure as to the correct stake for your wager or if you are unsure as to the correct number of permutations needed to correctly stake your wager please ask our shop staff before placing your wager. Should a wager be inadvertently under/over staked the following criteria will be used for settling purposes.

a) Under staked wagers; if a customer does not stake sufficient monies to cover the wager or if the wager shows incorrect permutation instructions for the number of selections stated then the returns will be reduced in proportion to the amount paid and will affect all separate wagers on the betting slip.

b) Overstaked wagers; if a customer stakes excess monies for the wager as written or if the wager shows incorrect permutation instructions for the number of selections stated then the returns will be increased in proportion to the amount paid. The excess monies are not refunded but invested on the selections given.

### **11. Forecasts**

Errors are common in forecast wagers where numbers are frequently used instead of named selections and we strongly recommend great care is taken in the timing of such wagers. Any winnings are paid to the official computer forecast return, which is declared to a £1 stake.

a) We accept forecast wagers on races of three or more runners

b) Where a straight forecast is accepted on a race which reduces to just two runners, the wager will stand as a win single on the first named selection. Where a reversed forecast is selected on such a race then the stake money will be equally divided between both selections.

c) Should one runner finish alone in a race and you have selected that runner in a forecast, wagers will be settled as the winner with any other selection.

d) In a straight or reversed forecast where one of the selections does not run, that wager will be deemed void.

d) We do not accept forecast wagers where unnamed favourites are selected and any such wagers accepted in error will be deemed void.

e) Where the instructions written are for a forecast wager but the selections are in different Races the wager will stand as win double on the selections stated.

f) For settlement purposes combination forecast wagers will be treated as a series of straight forecast wagers.

g) We accept forecast doubles only, where forecast trebles fourfolds fivefolds are accepted in error the wager will be deemed void.

h) In the event of non-runners in a forecast double wager the races containing the non-runners will be deemed void.

### **12. Tricasts**

Errors are common in tricast wagers where numbers are frequently used instead of named selections and we strongly recommend great care is taken in the timing of such wagers. Any winnings are paid to the official computer tricast return, which is declared to a £1 stake. It is the responsibility of the customer to check on the availability of a tricast dividend before their wager is processed.

a) Horse tricasts are accepted on all handicap races (and occasionally other races as advertised in our offices) where there are eight or more declared runners on the proviso that at least six run.

b) Greyhound tricasts are accepted on all races covered in full by S.I.S. provided six or more

dog's run. At certain major evening meetings a tricast dividend is returned.

c) If a tricast is accepted in error for a race in which no tricast dividend is returned the wager will stand as a forecast wager on the first two selections as written with the third selection being discounted for settling purposes. In the event of a combination tricast being accepted in error for a race in which no tricast dividend is returned the wager will stand as a combination forecast.

d) If a tricast is wagered where one of the selections becomes a non-runner, the wager will be deemed void.

e) We do not accept tricast wagers where unnamed favourites are selected and any such wager accepted in error will be deemed void.

f) Tricast wagers are accepted in singles only.

### **13. Any-To-Come (If Cash) & Conditional Wagers**

a) 'Any-to-come' or 'if-cash' wagers are accepted where instructions are clearly written.

b) We accept win and each way wagers of this type.

c) We do not accept 'stop-at-a-winner' or 'stop-at-a-loser' wagers and where taken in error these wagers will be deemed void, win or lose.

d) Returns from one selection or event cannot be re-invested onto the same selection or event.

e) You can choose to carry forward the same stake unit or a specific part of your potential returns from one selection to the next as we proceed through your list of A-T-C or 'if cash' wagers.

f) Where the stake unit is omitted from the A-T-C or 'if cash' wagers the unit stake on the selection immediately preceding will be used.

g) A-T-C or 'if cash' wagers are settled in the order that they appear on your betting slip until all the monies set aside have been used.

h) If the money staked (or subsequently carried forward) onto the next selection is insufficient to follow your instructions, then that selection will be settled in proportion to the amount available.

i) In each way wagers where the money staked (or subsequently carried forward) onto the next selection is insufficient to follow your instructions then the amount available will be divided equally between win and place and the selection will be settled in proportion to the amount available.

j) In 'up & down' or 'cross bets' one or more crosses (e.g. x or xxx) indicates single stakes about unless double stakes about (D.S.A.) is clearly indicated.

k) Each way 'single stakes about' or 'double stakes about' wagers will be settled as each way singles on each selection 'up & down' and not as separate win and place wagers.

### **14. Incorrectly Timed Wages**

a) Where a customer specifies a named selection (other than when a horse is doubly engaged See rule 14B) the wager will stand on the named selection irrespective of whether it is incorrectly timed or numbered in any way.

b) Where a selection is doubly engaged the following rules will apply;

i) If the selection is left un-timed then your wager will stand on that selection for whichever race it takes part in.

ii) If the selection is timed then your wager will stand for the race for which you have timed it only regardless of where the selection actually runs.

iii) If the selection is timed incorrectly for any of that selections chosen entries, your wager will stand for the race in which the selection actually runs.

c) If a selection is named incorrectly in such a way that it constitutes part or parts of other runners names that are taking part in the race for which the selection has been timed then the stake money will be equally divided between all possible runners covered by the selection as written (i.e. where Red Flyer is selected for a race which does not contain a Red Flyer but does contain Red Ruby and Magic Flyer then stake money would be divided equally between those two runners)

d) If a horse and greyhound with the same name run on the same day and it is unclear from your wager as to which one has been intended then the wager will stand on the horse selection unless one of the selections has already run in which case the wager will stand on the selection which has still to run. If one of these selections becomes a non-runner the wager will stand on the selection, which actually runs.

e) Where two horses are differentiated only by the suffix of their country of origin (i.e. Irish Hussar and Irish Hussar (USA)) un-timed wagers will be settled on the selection without the suffix unless the suffix is clearly marked on the betting slip when the wager is placed. If both names contain a suffix but no suffix is clearly marked on your betting slip then your wager will

- be settled on the first horse to run after your wager has been processed. If one of the horses has run when your wager is processed the wager will stand on the horse still to run.
- f) An incorrectly timed single wager will be taken for the next race at the meeting stated, subject to our 'off signal' procedure, unless the time stated can be related to another horse or greyhound meeting covered in full by S.I.S. The time written will always take precedence over any meeting written (i.e. when 3-58 Lingfield is written and there is a 3-58 at Monmore then the wager will stand on the 3-58 at Monmore unless our management are satisfied that a Lingfield race was intended)
- g) Where a selection is timed but no meeting stated (or a meeting not scheduled for that day is stated) then the wager will stand for the meeting with a race at that time. Should there be more than one meeting with a race at that time (covered by S.I.S) then the stake money will be divided equally.
- h) Where a selection is mis-timed or un-timed and no meeting is stated then the wager will stand on the next race to be run, subject to our 'off signal' procedure. Should numbers be used for the selections) the wager will stand for the next race to be run, subject to our 'off signal' procedure, to which the numbers) could apply.
- i) Where a time and meeting are stated but no selections) written the wager will be settled as being for the first favourite in the race stated.
- j) Should a race time stated on any unnamed selections be for a race that has already been run that wager will be deemed void.
- k) In multiple bets where unnamed selections are untimed or incorrectly timed then those selections shall be deemed void unless our management are satisfied that the sequence of selections made make the customers intentions absolutely clear.
- l) In multiple bets containing two (or more) selections in the same race then the wager will stand with the stake unit being divided where the two selections meet (i.e. a 10p Lucky 15 A,B,C,D where B and C are in the same race will become a 5p Lucky 15 A,B,N/R,D + a 5p Lucky 15 A,N/R,C,D .

#### **15. Insufficient & Incorrect Instructions On Wagers**

- a) Where a single stake and the name (or number) of a single selection is made the wager will be settled as a win single, unless each way is clearly marked.
- b) Where more than one selection is made and no instructions given we will endeavour to settle the wager as intended if it is obvious to our management, from the amount staked for the number of selections written, what was intended (i.e. 4 selections staked for £2-20 would be settled as 20p Yankee, 5 selections staked £3-10 would be settled as 10p Lucky 31). In such cases all bets would be settled to win unless clearly requested otherwise on the betting slip.
- c) Where the stake money does not obviously relate to any particular wager then the wager will stand as follows; 2 selections = win double, 3 selections win treble, 4 selections = win fourfold, etc...)
- d) Where a permutation is used which could apply equally to computer straight forecasts and computer tricasts the wager will be settled as forecasts unless tricasts are clearly requested.
- e) Where the number of selections written are insufficient for the specific instructions and stake written (or speciality slip used and stake written) then your wager will stand for the wager as instructed with non runners) being applied to bring the number of selections up to the wager as specified in your written instructions or speciality slip used (i.e. should you write three selections and specify 10p Lucky 15 (or use a Lucky 15 speciality slip) and stake £1-50 then your wager will be settled as a 10p lucky 15 using the 3 selections as stated + 1 non-runner )
- f) Where the number of selections written are more than for the specific instructions and stake written (or speciality slip used and stake written) then your wager will stand for the wager as instructed using the first selections as written up to the number of selections required for the wager as specified with the remaining selections) being discounted win or lose. (I.e. should you write four selections and specify 10p Patent and stake 70p then your wager will be settled as a 10p Patent using the first three selections as written with the fourth selection being discounted win or lose).
- g) When using speciality slips all wagers will be settled to win regardless of the unit stake written in the win stake box unless the each way box is clearly marked when the wager is accepted. (i.e if a customer writes 10p in the win stake box of a Lucky 15 speciality slip but stakes the wager for £3-00 then the wager will be settled as a 20p win Lucky 15)
- h) When using speciality slips if a customer writes the stake unit in the each way stake box but the total stake does not correspond with this stake unit, then the wager will be settled as an each way wager to a stake unit corresponding to the total stake ( i.e. if a customer writes 10p in the each way stake box of a Lucky 15 speciality slip but stakes the wager for £1-50 then the wager will be settled as a 5p each way Lucky 15 ).

**16. 'Day Of Race', 'First Show', 'Show' & 'SP' Horse Prices**

Dave Edwards Bookmakers offer the customer the opportunity to place wagers at 'Day of Race' (also known as 'Early Price'), 'First Show' (for a race taking place whilst our offices are open and covered in full by S.I.S.), 'Show' (once betting shows) have been passed by S.I.S.) and 'Starting Price'.

a) Dave Edwards Bookmakers offer many Early price races each day (subject to abandonments etc...) and because of the high volume of 'day of race' prices in comparison to other bookmakers it is not always possible for us to form a new market immediately upon the announcement of every non runner throughout the day and therefore occasionally prices shown on the display screens in our offices may be subject to a Rule 4 deduction despite the non runner being shown in the race, in all cases customers will be made aware of this by a message box showing 'Rule 4 applies' on the screen concerned.

b) 'Day of race' prices are the prices on offer (subject to fluctuation) in our offices prior to the 'first-show' being passed by S.I.S. and they will be available up until 15 minutes prior to the advertised 'off' time or until the first betting 'show' is passed by S.I.S. whichever is earlier. c) Wagers at 'day of race' prices are available win and each way.

d) Certain 'day of race' prices will be advertised in our offices as 'Best Odds' races in which, if the 'Starting Price' is greater than the 'day of race' price that you have taken, then your wager will be settled at the 'starting price' instead. 'Best Odds' races are highlighted on our screens.

e) When 'day of race' price is requested by the customer, then the price at which your wager will be settled is the price available via the slip capture settling system and our staff will endeavour to inform you of that price on your betting slip, however prices fluctuate during acceptance and the price at which your wager will be settled will be the actual price at the time the wager is processed, whether that price is higher or lower than any price written.

f) If your selection does not run, all single bets on that selection will be refunded.

g) In multiple bets, if your selection does not run, then for settlement purposes, your selection will be treated as a non runner. h) Tattersalls Rule 4 may be applied to 'day of race' prices if a horse quoted at 9/1\* or less becomes a non-runner.

i) Should you take a 'day of race' price and the 'Starting Price' is equal to or greater than the 'day of race' price you have taken, then Dave Edwards Bookmakers will not apply a rule 4 deduction.

j) Customers wishing to take 'First Show' on their wager should clearly indicate this on their betting slip by writing the words 'First Show' or 'F/S' next to the selections) where 'First Show' is required, if your instruction for 'First Show' is unclear, we reserve the right to settle The wager at 'Starting Price'.

k) Where an error is made by either the customer or our staff concerning a 'day of race' or 'show' price, the wager will be settled at the price which was available via the slip capture settling system at the time the wager was processed.

l) 'Day of race', 'Show' or 'First Show' must be clearly requested before the wager is processed through the slip capture terminal by our staff. Once processed, wagers can only have prices added or amended by voiding of the original wager and reprocessing of the wager with the required information added or deleted, we accept no responsibility for selections being late as a result of this reprocessing.

m) Where an incorrect 'Day of Race', 'Show' or 'First Show' price is passed in error, we reserve the right to settle wagers at the correct price at the time the wager was processed.

n) Should a horse or greyhound be withdrawn, no 'Show' price can be given pending the formation of a new market.

o) Any price taken on a selection will apply to all wagers on that selection on a betting slip unless clearly marked otherwise on the betting slip before acceptance.

p) We do not lay 'Bar' prices.

q) We do not lay prices on two-horse races and any wagers accepted in error will be settled at 'Starting Price'.

r) In the event of no starting price being returned then all starting price wagers will be settled at the Tote odds.

s) Withdrawals (other than Ante-Post wagers); When a horse is withdrawn without coming under Orders and there is insufficient time to form a new market a deduction will be made from all Winnings in accordance with Tattersall's Rule 4 as follows; (in the event of two or more horses being withdrawn the maximum deduction under this rule shall be 90p)

- a) 1/9 or shorter 90p
- b) 2/11 to 2/17 85p
- c) 1/4 to 1/5 80p
- d) 3/10 to 2/7 75p
- e) 2/5 to 1/3 70p
- f) 8/15 to 4/9 65p

- g) 8/13 to 4/7 60p
- h) 4/5 to 4/6 55p
- i) 20/21 to 5/6 50p
- j) EVS to 6/5 45p
- k) 5/4 to 6/4 40p
- l) 13/8 to 7/4 35p
- m) 15/8 to 9/4 30p
- n) 5/2 to 3/1 25p
- o) 10/3 to 4/1 20p
- p) 9/2 to 11/2 15p

**We don't charge 5p or 10p Rule 4's**

**17. Ante-post Wagers**

- a) Dave Edwards Bookmakers offer the 'non-runner, no bet' consolation bonus on many ante-post races throughout the racing season, several days prior to a race. This consolation (when in operation) is displayed at the bottom of the shop display screen showing prices for the ante-post event concerned. When available it must be clearly written and initialled on the betting slip by our staff at the time the wager is accepted. Please check with our staff if you are unsure as to whether the 'non-runner no bet' consolation is available at the time you place your wager.
- b) An ante-post wager is defined as one taken before 10a.m. on the day that the final declaration to run is made.
- c) Where the same selection is taken to win more than one event (i.e. Generous to win the 2000 Guineas and Derby, Manchester United to win the domestic treble, Tiger Woods to win all four Major's) the full accumulative odds will not apply and if such a wager at full accumulative odds is accepted in error then Rule 6. (Related Contingencies) will apply.
- d) On days when 'Classic' or other trials are taking place then ante-post betting will be suspended during and shortly after such trials until revised prices are issued.
- e) The following ante-post wagers will be deemed void;
  - i) Place only wagers
  - ii) Single bets on a race subsequently abandoned or where the conditions of a race are altered after a wager has been accepted.
  - iii) If a race is declared void.
  - iv) If we offer a 'with a run' price and the selection takes no part in the selected race.
  - v) A selection that is balloted out of a race under Jockey Club rule 125.
- f) Ante-post wagers do not qualify for any extra 'day of race' bonuses (i.e. a Lucky 15 placed on the Tuesday of the Cheltenham Festival but containing selections to run on the Wednesday or Thursday of the meeting where four winners are selected would only qualify for the standard Dave Edwards Bookmakers 10% bonus and not the 'daily bonuses as advertised in our shop for 'day of race' wagers.
- g) Any place terms for ante-post wagers should be written on the betting slip at the time the wager is accepted.
- h) We reserve the right to pay out on ante-post wagers only upon production of the official numbered receipt given by us at the time of acceptance of the wager.
- i) Where an error is made concerning an ante-post bet by either our staff or the customer we reserve the right to correct this error whenever it should come to our notice.
- j) Where we believe an alteration to the content of an ante-post wager has taken place after acceptance, we reserve the right to withhold payment pending a full investigation by our security department.

**18. Tote Betting**

- a) It is our aim for all Tote bets to be placed on 'mark-sense' slips via our Tote Direct wherever possible we will endeavour to do this, for Tote bets placed via this method no limits will apply with all wagers being settled according to Tote Direct rules which are available on request. However, occasionally for technical or logistical Reasons we are unable to accept Tote wagers via this method in which case Dave Edwards Bookmakers rules will apply as listed below.
- b) We are authorised by the Tote to accept Tote wagers on plain betting slips via our slip capture terminals. We accept placepots, quadpots, each way wagers, exactas and trifectas subject to our limits.
- c) We are unable to accept Scoop 6, jackpot and place only wagers without the availability of connection to Tote Direct betting pools.

- d) If a Scoop 6 wager is accepted in error on a plain slip it will be settled as an each way accumulator at starting price to the amount staked.
- e) If a jackpot wager is accepted in error on a plain slip it will be settled as a win accumulator at starting price to the amount staked.
- f) If a place only wager is accepted in error it will be settled as an equally divided win and place wager to the amount staked.
- g) For the maximum payout on Tote bets not processed via Tote Direct see Rule 2 (Maximum Payouts).
- h) Please note that Tote wagers or wagers requesting Tote dividends do not qualify for any consolations or bonuses.

### **19. Rules Exclusive To Greyhound Betting**

- a) a void race later re-run will still be taken as the race originally advertised and all bets will stand for the greyhounds that take part in the re-run.
- b) Stakes for single and forecast bets on a race to be re-run at a later time can be cancelled and refunded by mutual consent. Stakes will not be refunded on multiple bets.
- c) Any board price taken on a race later re-run will revert to S.P. unless a new price is agreed prior to the re-run.
- d) Where a selection is specified by trap number only and that trap is subsequently occupied by a reserve the wager will still stand on the trap number stated.
- e) Should a selection be specified by name (or name and trap number) the wager will be settled on the named selection only and should the selection not run the wager will be deemed void irrespective of whether a reserve runs or not.
- f) Where a selection is timed but with the wrong meeting for the time stated, the wager will stand for the race as defined by the time written with the meeting stated being disregarded (i.e. Should a selection be timed for the 3-58 at Monmore but the 3-58 race is actually at Crayford the wager will stand for the 3-58 at Crayford, subject to our 'off' signal procedure)
- g) Where a time is written but no selection stated the wager will stand as for the first favourite for the race as timed, subject to our 'off' signal procedure.
- h) If a greyhound is withdrawn from a race for whatever reason and a reserve runs in its place any price taken on un-named selections will revert to S.P.
- i) We do not accept unnamed second favourites on Greyhound racing.

### **20. Foreign Racing**

- a) we accept wagers for U.S. racing covered by S.I.S. or where we advertise that we are accepting wagers.
- b) On occasions where an industry SP is declared, wagers will be settled at the industry SP unless US Tote odds are clearly requested on the betting slip or a Dave Edwards Bookmakers 'early' or 'show' price has been taken.
- c) When no industry SP is available wagers will be settled at U.S. tote odds unless Dave Edwards 'early' or 'show' prices are available and requested at the time the wager is placed.
- d) Bets accepted with 'show' or 'early' prices may be subject to a Rule 4 deduction.
- e) Dividends will be declared to a £1 stake and customers should be aware that newspapers and other news media may declare returns to different units.
- f) For bets at US tote odds the number of places paid is determined by the number of runners (see rule 20m)) 8 or more runners – 1,2,3 (place part is 'show' dividend), 5 to 7 runners 1-2 (place part is the 'place' dividend), 4 or less runners – win only.
- g) Where a race features any 'coupling' of runners, that coupling stands for all win, each way and forecast betting when US tote odds are taken. When a Dave Edwards Bookmakers 'early' or 'show' price is taken or an industry SP is used then each selection will be treated as a separate betting entity.
- h) Double result concession is not applicable to any wager taken at US Tote odds.
- i) Straight forecasts (exactas) are accepted in singles, doubles only.
- j) Dual forecasts (quinellas) are not accepted and where accepted in error will be settled straight forecasts to divided/proportionate stakes.
- k) Tricasts (trifectas) and superfectas are not accepted and where accepted in error will be settled as straight forecasts to divided/proportionate stakes.
- l) We do not accept US exotics bets such as Daily Doubles, Pick 3's etc... and where accepted in error will be deemed void win or lose.
- m) For each way settlement purposes the number of runners is how many betting 'pockets' there are in a race, as any particular 'coupling' counts as one runner.
- n) We accept wagers for racing from France/Italy/Dubai/S.Africa and any other country where that race is covered by S.I.S. or where we advertise that we are accepting wagers upon that race.

- o) On occasions where an industry SP is declared, wagers will be settled at the industry SP unless Pari-Mutuel/Tote odds are clearly requested on the betting slip, or a Dave Edwards Bookmakers 'early' or 'show price' has been taken.
- p) When no industry SP is available, wagers will be settled at Pari-Mutuel/Tote odds unless Dave Edwards Bookmakers 'early' or 'show' prices are available and requested at the time the wager is accepted.
- q) Bets accepted with 'show' or 'early' prices may be subject to a Rule 4 deduction.
- r) Forecast / Dual Forecast / Tricast wagers are accepted subject to the dividends returned by the appropriate authority for the individual race concerned (i.e. where a dual forecast wager is accepted in error for a race in which no dual forecast dividend is returned that wager will stand as a ½ stake reversed forecast wager and if a tricast wager is accepted in error on a race where no tricast dividend is returned that wager will stand as a straight forecast wager on the first two selections as written.
- s) Please note that where Pari-Mutuel or any other tote dividends are requested then such wagers do not qualify for any consolations or bonuses.

### **RULES REGARDING NUMBERS BETTING**

#### **1. 49's**

- a) The maximum payout to any one customer or group of customers on any one 49's draw is £10,000
- b) Bets are accepted on 49's draws up to the official start time as broadcast by S.I.S. When a lunchtime or teatime draw is selected but accepted after the official start time, the bet will be settled on the next lunchtime or teatime draw available. If no draw is specified then the bet will be placed on the next draw to take place after the time of acceptance.
- c) When more than one draw has been selected, the bet will be settled on the next draws to take place consecutively. E.g. a lunchtime and teatime bet placed on a Friday after the lunchtime draw for that day has taken place will be settled on Friday teatime and Saturday lunchtime.
- d) 49's bets do not qualify for consolations or bonuses of any kind. E.g. We do not pay double the odds on 49's Lucky 15 bets with one correct number only.
- e) If, for any reason, a draw does not take place then bets will stand for the next available 49's draw unless cancelled by mutual consent.
- f) 49's bets may be placed on ordinary slips but where a six-fold is inadvertently included on any bet, it will be settled as five-folds with the stake proportioned.
- g) Multiple bets combining two 49's draws are not allowed.
- h) Bets mixing 49's and other sporting events are allowed, e.g. a double on number 31 in the teatime draw and a horse in the 5.30 at Kempton is acceptable. Customers should note that the 49's element of a multiple bet prevents any form of bonus or consolation being offered.
- i) Illegible figures will be treated as void and the bet reduced accordingly. For example, a treble with one illegible figure will be settled as a double at the appropriate odds.
- j) All bets are settled without the booster ball unless it is clearly requested.

#### **2. Irish Lottery (Lucky Chance)**

- a) The maximum payout to any one customer or group of customers, including bets from the same source, is £10,000 on any one Irish Lottery draw.
- b) Bets are accepted up to fifteen minutes prior to the draw being made. If we are satisfied that a bet was placed in good faith and that it was in time for the draw requested then the bet will stand. We reserve the right not to accept bets within the fifteen-minute cut-off period.
- c) At present, there are six draws a week – three on Saturdays and three on Wednesdays. The first draw to be made on a night is known as the 'main draw' or 'draw one'. The second draw to be made on a night is known as 'draw two' or the 'second draw' and the third is known as 'draw three' or 'third draw'
- d) The term 'all three' written on a slip will apply to draws on the same evening. If a customer would like to bet on both the Saturday and Wednesday draws, then this must be clearly marked on the slip.
- e) If an Irish Lottery bet is placed after an intended draw has taken place and 'Wednesday' or 'Saturday' has been stipulated, then the bet will stand for the next Wednesday or Saturday draw.
- f) If no draw is stated then the bet automatically goes on the next available draw.
- g) When 'Saturday' or 'Wednesday' is stated on a slip but no draw number is stated then the bet will be settled on the 'main draw' for the next Saturday or Wednesday draw.
- h) If, for any reason, a draw does not take place then bets will stand for the next draw unless

cancelled by mutual consent before the event. If specified days have been written on the slip then the next draw will be governed by these days.

- i) Bets are accepted on any of our specialised Irish Lottery slips or plain slips and are settled at Dave Edwards' odds at the time of acceptance.
- j) Understaked and overstaked bets will be settled in proportion.
- k) We accept Irish Lottery Patents, Yankees, Lucky 15's and other multiple bets but we do not pay bonuses or consolations on any such bets.
- l) When '6' or '7' number special is not stipulated on bets taken on plain slips, bets will be settled on the 6 number special.
- m) Two or more Irish Lottery draws may not be combined in accumulative bets. Any such bets taken in error will be settled at divided stakes.
- n) Illegible, inadmissible and duplicated numbers will be treated as void with bets reduced accordingly. E.g. a treble containing an illegible figure will be treated as a double at the appropriate odds.
- o) If too few numbers are entered on a slip for the bet indicated, then the bet will be settled at the odds applicable to the number of selections chosen.
- p) Multiple bets combining two Irish Lottery draws are not allowed.
- k) Bets mixing Irish Lottery and other sporting events are allowed, e.g. a double on number 31 in Saturday's main draw and a horse in the 5.30 at Kempton is acceptable. Customers should note that the Irish Lottery element of a multiple bet prevents any form of bonus or consolation being offered.

## **RULES REGARDING SPORTS BETTING**

### **1. Football**

- a) Unless otherwise stated all football bets are settled on 90 minutes play.
- b) 90 minutes play is deemed to be the match including any injury time added on by the referee but not any 'extra-time' 'golden/silver goal' or penalties.
- c) There is no limit to the maximum selections you may have.
- d) Unless included as part of a double with a LIVE T.V. match, a minimum of 3 selections are required for all wagers involving teams from Scottish divisions 1, 2 or 3 matches. Should a single or double be accepted in error on matches involving these selections, the wager will be deemed void, win or lose.
- e) 90 minutes play must be completed for a correct score wager to stand
- f) All correct scores are on 90 minutes play only. Extra time does not count.
- g) We offer separate prices for domestic and European/international matches and if domestic prices are given in error for European/international matches wagers will be settled at the correct price for European/international matches.
- h) On occasions we may advertise special prices for some matches on our screen systems and these will super-cede any prices displayed on our 'correct score' charts.
- i) Double result betting is available on most matches upon request, singles and upwards are accepted. Clients must select both the result at half-time and at full time, with selections being void if the match is abandoned prior to 90 minutes play being completed.
- j) Where a match is postponed or played on a different day to that advertised on a midweek coupon, wagers will stand providing the match takes place up to (and including) Saturday. Matches that take place after this will be deemed void.
- k) Where a match is postponed or played on a different day to that advertised on a weekend coupon, wagers will stand providing the match takes place up to (and including) the following Monday evening. Matches that take place after this will be deemed void.
- l) Under no circumstances will the result given by any 'pools panel' or any third party jury be accepted for settlement purposes.
- m) Any wagers on a match abandoned before the completion of 90 minutes play will be deemed void with the exception of 'first goal-scorer' wagers which will stand providing the first goal has been scored.
- n) If a change of venue takes place after our coupons have been printed all wagers will stand unless the change of venue leads to the away team becoming the home team in which case all selections on the match will be deemed void. (We will, wherever possible, attempt to indicate neutral venues on our coupons or our screen systems).
- o) With the exception of 'score-casts' (where a specific price is offered) related bets may not be combined where the result of one selection influences the outcome of the others). (i.e. Arsenal to win in 90 minutes and Arsenal to win 2-1 is not permitted in a double). Any such wager accepted in error will be settled with the stake divided as a single on each selection.
- p) First/Last player to score/ correct score doubles are accepted on all matches where prices are available. If a selected player takes no part the wager will be settled on the correct score at the

appropriate odds.

- q) If the only goals of a match are own goals, all score-cast bets will be settled on the correct score at the appropriate odds.
  - r) Should a match be abandoned before 90 minutes playing time has been completed 'first goal-scorer' wagers will stand. 'last goal-scorer' wagers will be deemed void. (Own goals do not count).
  - i) The first/last goal-scorer in a match is deemed as declared by the 'Press Association' which supplies football statistics to the media at the conclusion of a match. In the event of any dispute as to the first/last goal-scorer all wagers will be settled using 'Press Association' statistics only and no other results source.
  - ii) Should 'last goal-scorer' not be clearly stated at the time of acceptance all wagers will be settled as 'first goal-scorer' wagers.
  - iii) We will refund all 'first goal-scorer' wagers on players having taken no part or having come on after the first goal has been scored.
  - iv) All players who have started a match are deemed 'runners' whether they are on or off the pitch at the time the first goal is scored.
  - v) A player who takes any part in the official 90 minutes is deemed a 'runner' for 'last goal-scorer' settlement purposes.
  - vi) Where more than one player shares the same surname and there is no clear indication (i.e. initial, first name, team or price) the total stake will be divided equally between the possible intentions of the wager.
  - s) Prices from 'Our Specials board' cannot be mixed with any other sporting event (including horses and greyhounds) and any wagers accepted in error will be settled at football 'long list' prices along with the remaining selections.
  - t) If the minimum selections requirement on the special sections are not adhered to, all selections will revert to 'long list' rules and prices.
  - u) Wagers are accepted up to the advertised kick-off time. Should a wager be accepted after the match has kicked off the selection will be deemed void and, if an accumulative wager, will stand on the remaining selections. However, the wager will stand if accepted up to 5 minutes after kick-off providing no participant/team has gained any material advantage (i.e. a score, sending off, substitution etc...) subject to agreement with our management.
  - v) Permutations are accepted provided clear instructions as to the intentions of the wager are written.
  - w) Dates and kick-off times printed on our coupons are a guide only and if any kick-off times vary from those stated on the coupon, wagers will be settled on the actual kick-off time, any bets taken after the actual kick-off time will be deemed void win or lose.
  - x) All prices are subject to fluctuation and, whilst every effort will be made to bring any price changes to the customers attention at the time of acceptance, we reserve the right to settle all wagers at the correct price at the time of acceptance.
  - y) Prices displayed on our screen systems super-cede any prices on the pre printed coupons).
  - z) We do accept our competitors coupons.
- PLEASE NOTE: Any speciality bet we offer will be determined by the rules as displayed on our screen system at the time of acceptance. A copy of our screen data will be made available to customers in the event of any dispute. The result of any speciality market we offer will be deemed to be that as passed by the Press Association.

## 2. Golf

- a) The outright winner of any tournament is the player who takes the trophy, with play-offs counting.
- b) Once a player has teed off, they are deemed 'runners' and if the player withdraws for any reason all wagers on that player are lost.
- c) If the correct number of rounds/holes are not completed for any reason, the official result as issued by the governing body concerned will be used for settlement purposes.
- d) Group betting (incl. top nationality betting etc...) :
  - i) The player shooting the lowest score in that group is deemed to be the winner.
  - ii) If a selection misses the cut then that selection is deemed a loser.
  - iii) If all players in a particular group miss the cut the player shooting the lowest score prior to the cut is deemed to be the winner.
  - iv) Rule 4 may apply to groups containing any non-starters.
  - v) Dead-heat rules will apply except where the result is determined by a play-off.
- e) Where a price for the tie is quoted in any match betting market, in the event of both players matching scores, then all wagers on either players will be deemed losers.
- f) If a tournament is abandoned for any reason then wagers will stand providing an official result is announced, however any wagers placed, after which no further play takes place will be deemed void.

- g) When two players in a match bet miss the cut, the player with the lowest aggregate scores over the first two rounds will be deemed the winner.
  - h) Two and three ball betting will be deemed void on a round that is not completed or if one player fails to start.
  - i) If a player misses the cut, all tournament match and group betting will stand.
- PLEASE NOTE: Any speciality bet we offer will be determined by the rules as displayed on our screen system at the time of acceptance. A copy of our screen data will be made available to customers in the event of any dispute. The result of any speciality market we offer will be deemed to be that as passed by the Press Association.

### **3. Rugby**

- a) All wagers are settled on 80 minutes play, 'extra-time' or 'sudden death' does not count unless outright betting is available and clearly requested on the slip at the time of acceptance.
  - b) All wagers without prices marked on will be settled on our handicap markets with prices applicable at the time of acceptance unless clearly requested otherwise on the slip.
  - c) All wagers will be settled at the accumulative odds available on our screen systems at the time of acceptance
  - d) Prices and handicaps are subject to fluctuation and possession of a coupon does not guarantee any price or handicap to any customer and, whilst every effort will be made to bring any price or handicap changes to the attention of the customer at the time of acceptance, we reserve the right to settle all wagers at the correct price at the time of acceptance.
  - e) Prices displayed on our screen systems super-cede any prices available on our coupons.
  - f) Bets placed after the actual kick off time will be deemed void win or lose.
  - g) When a change of venue takes place all wagers will stand unless the change of venue leads to the away team becoming the home team, in which case all selections on the match will be deemed void.
  - h) Any wagers on a match abandoned before the completion of 80 minutes play will be deemed void with the exception of i) first try scorer wagers which will stand providing a try has been scored.
  - j) First try scorer wagers are accepted where advertised and settlement is made upon statistics issued by the press association upon completion of the match.
  - k) We do not accept wagers on last try scorer and where accepted in error will be deemed void win or lose.
  - l) We will refund all wagers on first try scorer where the selection has played no part or come on after the first try has been scored.
  - m) Winning margin wagers, where available are calculated from scratch (i.e. no handicaps)

### **4. Tennis**

  - c) If a player retires before the completion of a match but after the completion of the first set, all wagers on set betting will be deemed void but match bets will stand for the official winner (i.e. the player progressing to the next round).
  - d) Any wager placed after a match has started will be deemed void win or lose.

## 6. Cricket

- a) If any match is abandoned due to outside interference all wagers will be deemed void.

  - c) If for any reason there is a change of opponents then that match will be deemed void for settling purposes.
  - d) In one-day matches where no price is quoted for the draw, then dead heat rules apply unless the official competition rules do not determine a winner.
  - e) In Test matches all wagers will be settled on the official result as long as one ball has been bowled.
  - f) In Test matches in the event of a tie dead-heat rules apply.
  - g) In Test matches series correct score wagers will be deemed void if the correct number of tests are not played.
  - h) In test matches series wagers will stand on the official series result.
  - i) In County Championship matches in the event of a draw all wagers will be deemed void unless prices were quoted for the draw.
  - j) Top bowler/batsman wagers on any player not in the starting eleven will be deemed void.
  - k) Top bowler/batsman wagers on any player who is in the starting eleven but does not bowl/bat will be deemed losers.
  - l) If outside influences reduce the number of scheduled overs then the following number of overs must be bowled for wagers to stand (unless all out).
    - i) One day internationals – minimum 25 overs must be bowled (unless all out) or wager void.
    - ii) C & G Trophy – minimum overs must be bowled (unless all out) or wager void.
    - iii) 20/20 Trophy – minimum 6 overs must be bowled (unless all out) or wager void.
  - m) In certain matches we may offer prices on top handicapped batsman – the handicaps are added on to the runs achieved by each individual batsman – dead heat rules may apply.
